Alarms need registering

NORMAN — Anyone with an automatic fire or security alarm system in a home or business within the city limits must have a permit and register with the city, according to Norman's municipal code. Annual registration was once required, but beginning with last year's registrations, alarm permit stickers no longer have an expiration date, said police Lt. Jay Callaghan. Permit stickers are now issued to first-time registrants and to those who failed to register last year. For more information, call 321-1600.

Resurfacing to take two weeks

EDMOND — Work to resurface part of Covell Road started Monday and is expected to take two weeks with cooperative weather. Work will be from 1,300 feet west of Bryant Avenue to Coltrane Road. One lane will be open at all times during the work period. Motorists should expect delays and are encouraged to find an alternate route if possible. The resurfacing is part of the scheduled 2014-15 mill and overlay projects for the city of Edmond. Atlas Paving is contractor, with a total cost of \$3.9 million.

Screenings offered

Parents concerned about their child's developmental progress can receive free developmental and autism screenings this month through a program offered by Rainbow Fleet and the University of Oklahoma Health Science Center.
